We continue to have speeding cars throughout the neighborhood. BPD does


patrol, but we need more. Please contact BPD if you notice speeding. More voices might get more patrols.

Yes, they find a soft place on the ground to secure a nest and lay their eggs. They should be a welcomed guests here in Baynard since they eat mostly insects, including beetles, caterpillars, and grasshoppers. You can see them often running around the streets.

Preparing for Hurricane Season

The hurricane season along the Atlantic and Gulf of Mexico coasts of the United States started on June $1^{S\dagger}$ and runs through the end of November. This year is predicted to be a challenging one for the millions of people who live in these areas.

A recent article in the Bluffton Today, the Town of Bluffton reminds us of the five "Ps" in preparing for a hurricane. These are:

People (Pets): when making an evacuation plan keep in mind who needs to be in your plan. Where are you going in the case of evacuation? If you have a pet, ensure your lodgings allow for animal guests.





Prescriptions: what prescription medicine do you and the people in your plan take daily? Make sure you have at least a two-week supply of prescribed medicine. What type of over-the-counter medicines do you need to bring with you?

Paper: (i.e. important documents): before evacuating make sure you have all of your personal documents to ensure you have what you need and they don't get lost or damaged during the storm.

Personal needs: this can include medication, toiletries, clothes, and anything that you need to get through the day.

Priceless items: Pack your photo albums and any important items to ensure they aren't damaged or lost.

Community Compliance Reminders

Important Community Reminders

Landscaping

Ground cover, pine straw or mulch, is usually applied twice a year to maintain aesthetics, control weeds, and define plating beds. Also be sure to arrange seeding or sod to repair any bare areas in your lawn. All shrubbery shall be regularly trimmed and must not impede walkways or roadway line of sight. All shrubbery and foundation plantings cannot exceed 7ft in height.

Golf Carts

All carts must be registered with the SCDMV, have valid insurance, and must follow all state and local rules of the road. Carts and ATVs are strictly prohibited on sidewalks/bike trails, the courts, around ponds and landscaped areas.

Exterior Maintenance

The exterior of the home, including roof areas, must be kept free from mold and mildew. All painted surfaces must not be faded including doors, shutters, and garage doors. Mailboxes must not be faded, moldy, or rusted and should be refreshed by washing and/or painting as needed.

Trash Cans

Trash cans and recycling bins are permitted out on collection day, but must be stored in the garage or service yard all other days. Garage can or recycle bin must not be placed in the street! Both should be returned to an appropriate storage area by 9pm that day of pick up.

Rent your home? Communicate with your tenant for a better association!

There are several homes within the association that are rentals; don't leave those residents out of the information loop! When you receive an email from the POA, please forward it on. It's imperative tenants are just as informed, possibly more so since they are living within the community itself.

Vehicle Parking, Boats and Trailers

Please remember to park vehicles on the parking pad, driveway and/or within the garage of the home with all four-tires on the poured concrete. RVs, campers, boats, etc. may be temporarily stored completed in a driveway or parking pad for no more than 48 hours within a seven-day period. Overflow parking is available with notification to the Association Manager. Moving vans and portable storage units must be parked in the driveway and for no longer than 72 hours.

Pond remediation, sidewalk trip hazards throughout the community, paver repairs, and new landscaping at the entrance. Stay up to date!
Ensure your email is on file with IMC. The POA communicates primarily through eblasts or use of the boards at the entry and amenity center.

REMINDER

Baynard Park is proud to be pet-friendly, and we're happy your four-legged family members are part of our community, but recently we've had some complaints.

Of course, like any good neighbor, it's important that these pets don't create an unpleasant environment for everyone else. To avoid unnecessary disputes and potential rule violations, here are some guidelines residents should follow to ensure their furry friends continue to be a welcome addition to the neighborhood.

Remember, pets must be leashed at all times when outside of your home. Not only is this a community rule, it's the law as well! Recurring concerns with off-leash dogs should be reported to IMC and/or Beaufort County Animal Services at (843) 255-5010

Pet waste must be cleaned up, again, it's the law! No one wants to see, smell or accidently step in the "gift" your dog left on the grassy common area or neighbors' lawns. So, when your dog needs to go, be sure to properly dispose of it. Not only will this keep the community looking better, but it will help keep groundwater clean and help prevent the spread of fecal-borne diseases. Please utilize the pet waste stations located throughout our community.

Please also be cognizant of your dog kicking mulch, sod or other areas. If this occurs, please try to remediate the area back to its original state.
